

## **Some practical information regarding the Comparative Humanities conference**

The conference Comparative Humanities will be held at Södertörn University, which is south of the city centre and easily accessible by commuter train. The conference will open for registration at 8.30 am on 27 October; the opening address and first keynote will then be at 9.15 am. The conference ends in the evening of the 28<sup>th</sup>. There will be no conference fee, and lunch, dinner and coffee for the two conference days is included as part of the conference package.

Audovisual equipment for powerpoints etc. will be available at the conference venue.

To get to Södertörn, you need to take the so-called Pendeltåget (commuter train) from the Central Station – or from Södra Station, if you are staying in that part of town. It must be the train headed for Södertälje or Tumba, but you get off at Flemingsberg. The trip from the Central Station to Flemingsberg takes about 17 minutes. Once in Flemingsberg, you will see Södertörn University to your right, up on the bluff, which you reach by escalator. The conference venue is Södertörn University F-11. It is located in the F building in Moas Båge. You will find further directions and a map of the campus at [www.sh.se](http://www.sh.se)

There is of course a wide range of hotels in Stockholm – but it's a good idea to book well in advance! We would suggest the Nordic Sea Hotel ([www.nordicseahotel.se](http://www.nordicseahotel.se)) and the budget alternative Hotell Zinkensdamm ([www.zinkensdamm.com](http://www.zinkensdamm.com)) as our preferred conference hotels. If you wish to stay very close to the train station, Hotell Terminus is also an alternative.
